Icon of Pakistan - Mohenjo-daro

Mohenjo-daro sits on an elevated ground in the modern day Larkana district of Sindh province in Pakistan. It was built around 2600 BC (some archeologists put the date as early as 3500 BC) and was occupied until between 1700 BC and 1300 BC. The city existed at the same time as the civilizations of the ancient Egypt, Mesopotamia and Crete.

Mohenjo-daro was first discovered in 1922 by R.D. Banerji. Large scale excavations were undertaken by John Marshall, K.N. Dikshit, Ernest Mackay, etc. throughout the 1930s, and the most recent was conducted by G.F. Dales in the 1950s.

Spread over approximately 250 hectares, the ancient city is regarded as the largest of the known Indus cities. It is also among the most preserved of the Indus Valley Civilization sites with structures made primarily of fired adobe brick. Mohenjo-daro is designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The people of Mohenjo-daro manufactured seals and beads, and worked on copper, carved shells and ivory. Stone carvings of seated male figures may represent ancestral leaders of the community, and not priests or kings although these are labeled as the 'priest king'. Many other figurines, in the form of human and animal figurines were produced from terracotta, bronze, faience and shell, none more famous than the miniature bronze statuette of a female, known as the dancing girl. This statue was discovered in 1926 and is considered the most prized artifacts unearthed from the archeological site.

The electricity supply in Karachi is 220 - 240 AC Volts.

CREDIT CARDS

Major credit cards (i.e. Master Card and Visa) are accepted in Karachi. Hotels and large departmental stores also accept these cards. Local currency can be obtained from ATMs (subject to the services offered by your bank).
